• Village real estate taxes for the second half of the year were mailed the week of November 24 and are due no later than December 31. If you do not receive your tax bill by December 3, you may obtain a copy by visiting the Tax Office on the second floor of Village Hall, One College Place or by calling (516) 678-9242 between the hours of 9 A.M. and 3 P.M.

• Applications for partial exemption from Village real estate taxes must be filed at the Tax Office by December 31. If granted, exemptions become effective June 1, 2004.

Exemptions are available for seniors aged 65 and older with a gross income not exceeding \$32,400; for persons with disabilities with a gross income not exceeding \$32,400; for veterans based on the date and type of military service: and for volunteer firefighters with five years or more of certified service.
