Pilot Program for Recyclable Plastics

Village residents in two areas will be able to dispose of their recyclable plastic trash in a convenient and environmentally responsible manner thanks to a pilot program by the Rockville Centre Sanitation Department that starts the week of June 4. Residents in the two pilot areas, one in the north and one in the south, will be able to add most plastics to the blue Rockville Centre recycling bins, along with glass and cans, on their usual pick-up day.

A Village map showing the pilot areas is online at the Village website www.rvcny.us. Residents in those areas have received letters explaining the system and will receive telephone calls reminding them of the start date.

"Recycling contracts now allow us to commingle glass, cans and plastics," Village Engineer Steve Kritsas said.

"We will be monitoring the pilot program for four to five months with the intention of expanding it throughout the Village."

Village to Offer Daily Parking Permits

Rockville Centre residents may now purchase a one-day parking permit for their occasional trips into Manhattan on the Long Island Rail Road. Currently, long term parking near the station is available only to holders of annual permits.

The pilot program, beginning June 4, will make available eight daily permits to park in Municipal Parking Field #14 on Maple Avenue and St. Mark's Avenue. The permits cost \$12 and will be issued by the Cashier's Office in Village Hall.

The permits are available on a first-come, first-served basis and may be purchased up to 30 days in advance.

Village Elections June 19

Village residents will go to the polls on Tuesday, June 19 from 6 A.M. to 9 P.M. at 10 different locations to elect a mayor, a Village justice and two trustees, all to four-year terms. There is also a referendum on whether to allow eligible volunteer firefighters to continue to earn service credits for the Fire Service Awards after the age of 65.

Any Village resident who is regis-

tered to vote in Nassau County may vote in the Village election. Unregistered newcomers, those who have changed addresses since last November, and new voters must register with the County Board of Elections by June 8 in order to be eligible to vote in this election.


Residents planning to vote by absentee ballot must file an application at Village Hall no later than June 18.

Softball Field Named for Bob Klein

The softball field at the Skelos Sports Complex was named in honor of longtime RVC Little League official Robert Klein at a special ceremony on May 12. Klein had a 21-year career in the league, including 10 years as president, the longest tenure in the league's history.

On Opening Day in March, Mayor Eugene Murray praised Klein for being "a positive role model for Little League coaches and officials" and for earning "the greatest respect and admiration from his fellow coaches and from his players and their parents."

Village Board Approves

Pride Committee Recommendations

The Village Board of Trustees has approved a slate of short-term recommendations proposed by the new RVC Pride Beautification Committee, chief among them enforcing the 30 mile per hour speed limit on Sunrise Highway and designating the July 7 Village anniversary as the occasion to "kick-off" a variety of Pride Committee initiatives.

Committee Co-Chair Cyd Beth Charrow, D.S.W., told the Board at a special briefing on May 14 that the 70 volunteers on the committee wanted to create a "consistent image" for Rockville Centre that differentiated it from surrounding communities.

Among the proposals accepted by the Board are plans to upgrade the east and west entrances to the Village, to standardize equipment and material used for planters, benches, brickwork and banners, and to beautify the parking lots behind commercial buildings.

In a 21-page report presented to the


Summer Birthday Parties

\$100K Renovation for Morgan Days Park

The Village Board of Trustees has approved a plan to renovate and resurface the basketball courts at Rev. Morgan Days Park.

Ralph C. Bumbaca has been a contributing member of the Rockville Centre community since moving here with his family 10 years ago to a home on Pine Street, from Brooklyn. Mary W. Bossart served as a Village Trustee from 1997 to 2005. She has lived in Rockville Centre over 40 years. Prior to her election to the Village Board, Mary served on the Board of Zoning Appeals. She also worked for the Nassau County Commission on Charter Revision as Special Assistant for Administration.

Mary holds a B.S. from Cornell University, an M.A. from New York University, and a J.D. from St. John's Law School. She is an attorney and a NYS certified nutritionist. Charles R. Joyce Candidate for Village Trustee



Chuck Joyce of Southard Avenue grew up in Rockville Centre, his family having moved into the Village in 1949. Employed by Nassau County for over 33 years, Mr. Joyce recently retired as director of the Office of Child Support Collection & Enforcement, where he was responsible for the supervision of 130 employees.

Joyce received his Bachelor of Science degree in management from New York Institute of Technology, served in the U. S. Army between the years 1966 and 1968 and has been a dedicated member of the all volunteer RVC Fire Department since his teens, having responded to over 15,000 calls since 1985 alone.

In addition to his work in the RVC Fire Department, Chuck has been active in various volunteer activities and services, including, being a member in the inaugural classes of emergency medical technicians (EMT) and AMT's. A former American Red Cross first aid and CPR instructor, Chuck represents the Nassau County Executive on the Regional Emergency Medical Service Council (REMSCO), where today he is president of REMSCO Inc.. Chuck is also a past president of the Kiwanis Club of RVC and worked on the RVC Community Development Committee and the RVC Community Fund Golf Committee.

Chuck and his wife Jean, daughter of retiring Mayor Eugene Murray, were married in 1972. They moved into their home in 1976, where they raised their two sons, Charles, a fire protection engineer and Joseph, a NYC police officer. Both sons are active members in the RVC Fire Department.

Andrew P. Karamouzis Candidate for Village Mayor



Andrew P. Karamouzis has served as a Village Trustee since July 2005. A partner with the RVC law firm of Moran • Karamouzis LLP, Andrew earned a B.A. in history from the University of Pennsylvania and his J.D. from Fordham University School of Law, where he was a member of the Law Review.

Prior to being elected as a Village Trustee, Andrew served as *pro-bono* attorney for the RVC Citizens Association and advocated for Village residents on a variety of civic and development issues. He organized town hall meetings and presented expert testimony on behalf of Village residents to the Planning Board regarding the proposed Signature Place 349-unit rental apartment project and its potential impact on the community.

Andrew is married to Siobhan Moran, who along with her six brothers, grew up on Ardsley Place, across the street from Hewitt Elementary School. Siobhan's parents, Gene and Grace Moran, have lived in the Village since 1963. Siobhan and Andrew returned to the Village in 1996 and live on Wright Road, where they are raising two daughters, Delia, age 9 and Kate, age 5. Both girls attend Covert Elementary School and are active in RVC Soccer, RVC Little League and Daisy Scouts.

Andrew's community activities include volunteering as a soccer coach for the RVC Soccer Club and a basketball coach at St. Paul's Cathedral. Andrew is a first-generation Greek-American, who began working at age 9 in his father's Manhattan old world food store on Ninth Avenue and continued through high school, college and law school.

David A. Krasula Candidate for Village Trustee


