The extensive renovation was accomplished as a public/private partnership whereby the Village supplied the land and Molloy College the capital to build the new complex. Both residents and college athletes will benefit from the partnership. twenty-year agreement with the Village of Rockville Centre to further improve the athletic facilities at the Skelos Sports Complex. The Bob Klein Softball Field gives the college an NCAA-regulation softball field and provides the Village as well as the Rockville Centre School District with the cost-free use of the upgraded field.

"I am ecstatic to bring one of the top softball facilities in the region to Rockville Centre," commented Mayor Francis X. Murray. "It gives our children a wonderful opportunity to play on a modern NCAA field. Our local sports organizations are gaining first-class synthetic surface fields. Village of Rockville Centre Deputy Mayor Nancy Howard, President of Molloy College Drew Bogner, Village of Rockville Centre Mayor Francis X. Murray and Molloy College Softball Head Coach Susan Cassidy-Lyke cut the ribbon on the new state-of-the-art NCAA softball field at Bob Klein Field.

Field now features a state-of-the-art playing surface consisting of an artificial turf outfield and DuraEdge clay infield. Also included are an enclosed sixty-foot precast dugouts with storage, designated and enclosed bullpens on the first- and third-base sides, a sixty-by-thirty-three foot enclosed batting cage beyond the left-field fence, a 150-seat grandstand with an elevated press box located behind home plate, and permanent outfield fencing set for NCAA regulation depths. Existing lights have been maintained and utilized for the facility, making it the only complex with NCAA standard playing lights in the East Coast Conference.

In addition to the renovations to Klein Field, an artificial turf tee-ball field is being constructed beyond the center field wall, complete with fifty-foot bases, team benches, water fountains, and a backstop. This maintenance-free area will provide the Village additional space for its growing youth softball programs to play games.

"We are pleased to be partnering with the Village of Rockville Centre on this project," said Drew Bogner, Ph.D. and President of Molloy. "It will provide an all-weather surface that will expand the availability and utilization of the field."

VILLAGE HALL COMMENTS

Springtime in Rockville Centre

As you read this the weather is warming, the days are lasting longer and our beautiful Village is experiencing a much needed renaissance after a difficult period during which we experienced large scale business vacancies, near double digit tax rate increases and a deterioration of our roads and parks.

This coming year's budget limits the Village tax increase to the lowest rate

since before the onset of the Great Recession, and second lowest in more than a decade. More importantly, even with spiraling statemandated spending increases the Village managed to keep the total spending almost directly in line with inflation for the year.

This tax plan falls within the state imposed tax cap limit yet the Village continues to properly fund its departments making sure that they continue to provide the level of service that Rockville Centre's residents expect and deserve. As trustee-liaison to the Sandel Senior Center it gave me great pleasure to advocate on behalf and ensure that the budget for our senior services was maintained. This was necessary because of the invaluable service that is offered to and needed by the most financially vulnerable members of our Village family.

This coming year, the Village will be doubling the number of miles of Village roadways that will be repaved and repaired, increasing the number of older fire

department vehicles that are replaced, and continuing the repair, remodeling and improved maintenance of our ball fields. This continuation of providing a high level of services, while facing ever increasing state mandated costs and simultaneously keeping Village taxes at a fair and low level has been accomplished by responsible budgeting and the increasing utilization of alternative sources of revenue such as the South Nassau Hospital parking field

agreement.

This year we will also be welcoming to our downtown new businesses that will fill some of the most glaring vacancies. The vacant RKO movie theater has been the black eye of our downtown for over six years and is now being taken down and replaced by a beautiful new restaurant. This trend of an increasing occupancy rate of our downtown is the direct result of smart planning by a Village Board majority who saw the need to make our downtown more inviting to businesses and their patrons.

Finally, with the building code changes implemented two years ago and more recently amended, residents are once again making improvements to their property at an increasing rate while the character and integrity of our Village is being protected from a projected onslaught of McMansions.

It really is springtime in Rockville Centre!

Transfer Station Open

The Village Transfer Station has resumed service on the first and third Saturdays of the month until November 17 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The Station, on Sunrise Highway adjacent to the Public Works building, is open to the public to receive large items of trash, including furniture and appliances. Proof of residency is required.

Sandy Rebuilding Fee Waiver

The Rockville Centre Board of Trustees has announced that residential property owners will not have to pay the usual permit fees when rebuilding property damaged

by Superstorm Sandy. The waiver is being extended until December 3, 2013 and applies "in kind" replacement construction only, not to any additional improvements.

Maintain Fee Moratorium

The Rockville Centre Board of Trustees has extended a moratorium on a fee imposed on residents seeking to legalize building conditions for which they have no permits.

The maintain fee normally \$1,190, will be waived until October 10, 2013 in a pilot program to encourage residential property owners to legalize construction which is not in compliance with local and NYS codes.
