23rd Annual St. Patrick's Parade to Hit the Streets of Rockville Centre

The 23rd Annual Rockville Centre St. Patrick's Parade begins at Noon on Saturday, March 23, starting from Maple Avenue and Long Beach Road and proceeding to the reviewing stand in front of St. Agnes Cathedral.

"The Annual St. Patrick's Parade is one of the most exciting days of the year in Rockville Centre," commented Mayor Francis X. Murray. "The downtown shops are booming; the streets are full of Rockville Centre pride and the Village is able to give back to three worthy causes."

This year's Grand Marshal is Dr. Drew Bogner, PhD, President of Molloy College. From Dr. Bogner's guidance to the students that pass through the hallways at Molloy College, to the thousands of people he touches through his philanthropic work, his commitment to others is unwavering. Enrollment has grown at unprecedented levels during his tenure as President of Molloy College, and has rapidly expanded its leadership initiatives in the business and service communities. But most importantly, Dr. Bogner spends countless hours helping the community by serving on the Boards of Catholic Charities, Long Island Housing Partnership, Long Island Index, Long Island Works Coalition, Rotacare and the Chair of the Dominican Higher Education Council.

Over the last 20 years, the Rockville Centre St. Patrick's Parade, which is known as "The Parade that Cares and Shares" (B), has become one of the most successful and well-attended parades in New York State. It has become a source of not only cultural pride, but civic pride, as well. The parade is an incorporated notfor-profit organization that annually shares its success with three worthy charities, which are National, Irish, and locally focused. Since the parade's inception in 1997, \$1,224,000.00 has been distributed to 67 individual Charities.

This year's charities are The Opening Word, The HEARTest Yard, and the New York Irish Center. The Opening Word is a literacy, ESOL, and job readiness program that unlocks the language ability of adult participants, providing them with a key to future personal empowerment, increased civic and social responsibility, service program administered by Levine Children's Hospital in Charlotte, NC. The cutting-edge program provides families of babies affected by congenital heart disease with a multitude of services including in-home, private nursing care, physical therapy and speech therapy among other benefits. The New York Irish Center is a community center in Long Island City, providing a home for the Irish at heart, building and researching community through culture, identity and friendship.

Village Achieves Highest Possible Credit Rating

The Village of Rockville Centre was awarded the highest rating possible from Standard & Poor's Rating Service (S&P), a AAA.

"I am extremely proud of our high ratings with S&P," commented Mayor Francis X. Murray. "My administration has worked diligently to bring about fiscal discipline to the operation of our Village while not impacting services. Much of this can be attributed to the professional team we have in place in Rockville Centre." According to a statement released by S&P, the rating reflects the agency's view of numerous factors including the Village's strong economy, strong management, strong budgetary performance and flexibility, liquidity, debt and contingent liabilities, and institutional framework. As part of the rating the Village was also assigned a "stable" outlook.







Around Our Community

Village Secures \$2.1 Million in State Funding for Iron Filtration Plant

At the December 3rd Board of Trustees meeting, Mayor Francis X. Murray announced that the Village of Rockville Centre will be awarded an additional \$2,120,464 in state funding through the New York Water Infrastructure Improvement Act with the help of Senator Todd Kaminsky. The grant was awarded through Governor Cuomo's office and will enable the Village to build an Iron Filtration plant along Maple Avenue. Last year, Senator Todd Kaminsky secured \$953,121 in grant funding to support drinking water and wastewater infrastructure projects in Rockville Centre.

"Infrastructure upgrades to protect our water resources are imperative for the health and safety of our residents and businesses, as well as keeping Rockville Centre a desirable community," commented Village of Rockville Centre Mayor Francis X. Murray. "The funds secured from this grant will be used for the Village's Iron-Removal Treatment Plant located on Maple Avenue. The new plant, will provide up to 5.6 million gallons of iron free water daily to Village residents. I would like to thank Senator Todd Kaminsky for his hard work in securing grant monies that ensures our Village has the funds to improve our water system."

The Rockville Centre Water Department provides water from 10 wells located throughout the Village. The water is stored in four elevated tanks with a combined capacity of 4 million gallons and is distributed through more than 70 miles of water main. The water quality is constantly monitored and tested to assure its purity. The iron-filtration system will use a sand and anthracite media to trap iron molecules as they pass through filter vessels.

"In today's day and age, it is unacceptable to drink water that is anything but clear and pristine," said Senator Todd Kaminsky. "I am glad to have helped for this critical infrastructure upgrade to provide iron-free water to the Rockville Centre community."

Village Sees Green with Urban Forestry Grant


The Village of Rockville Centre has been awarded a \$47,295 grant in Environmental Protection Fund (EPF) grants for urban forestry projects by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). Funds from the grant will be used to create an inventory of trees, the first step toward replacing sick trees in the Village of Rockville Centre.

"Trees and green spaces are an important part of Rockville Centre," commented Mayor Francis X. Murray. "The DEC understands the benefits of community and urban forests in protecting our clean air, clean water, energy savings, and an improved quality of life. I would like to thank Senator Todd Kaminsky for his hard work in securing grant monies that are a valuable tool to support local projects to develop and manage these resources."

The grant will enable the Village to do an inventory of 4,000 trees in the downtown and main business districts. The inventory will include a data collection of tree species, location, GPS coordinates, tree size, multi-stem tree, condition, primary maintenance, defects, tree risk assessment and rating, residual risk, further inspection, overhead utilities, location of empty and/or potential tree planting sites and date of inventory.

"Rockville Centre has been known to be 'Tree City, USA' and their residents reap the benefits of their beautiful trees," said Senator Todd Kaminsky. "I am glad to have helped the Village of Rockville Centre secure a grant to inventory their trees, which go a long way to continuing to beautifying the Village."

Get alerted about emergencies and other important community news by signing up for the Village's Swift 911. This system enables the Village of Rockville Centre to provide residents with critical timely information in a variety of situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons, evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods, and power outages. Residents can register for Swift 911 on the Village's website at www.rvcny.us.



Snow Reminders

In the event of a snowstorm, the Village urges residents not to go out during or immediately after a snowstorm unless it is necessary. Crews will be able to do their job more quickly and completely if there is less traffic on the roads.

Residents and business owners are reminded that all sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours after the end of a storm and snow should not be thrown into the roadway when clearing their driveways and sidewalks. If you have a fire hydrant on your property, snow should be cleared so they may be located easily in case of an emergency. Corner properties are responsible for clearing to the corner and curb cut access to allow pedestrian access to sidewalks. as soon as possible in order to avoid billing errors and penalties.

Village Hall Comments by Deputy Mayor Kathleen Baxley



On behalf of the Board of Trustees and Mayor Francis X. Murray, I wish all of our residents a happy and healthy 2019. I am proud of the many accomplishments we achieved in our Village over this past year. Personally, my experiences as Deputy Mayor have brought me closer to many more people in our community, as I have had the opportunity and privilege to interact and work with so many of our neighbors, residents, and business owners.

In 2018, we continued with our goal of keeping Rockville Centre a great place to live, work, and play. Many improvements were made to our facilities, including the addition of a second iron filtration plant on Maple Avenue. The filtration plant will be operational this spring and will filter out the iron, thereby alleviating the appearance of "rust" in our water caused by the iron. Additionally, the pump station on Seaman Avenue is being completely refurbished with new pumps and new pipes to ensure that our sewage will be properly taken care of. Lastly, our road program continued in 2018 with the complete resurfacing of several miles of roadways.

As liaison to the Rockville Centre School District, the Rockville Centre Fire Department, the Sandel Senior Center, the Recreation Center and the MLK Center, I continue to work with these departments and their supervisors to ensure the continuation of the excellent programs offered to our community, as well as to identify and make any needed improvements. The Rockville Centre Fire Department received new bunker gear and bailout systems to ensure the safety of our volunteer firefighters

during emergencies. The Recreation Center added a fourth nursery school class and new programs for our youngest residents. The Sandel Center received a new outdoor patio and pergola from FOSSI, the fundraising arm of our Senior Center, and planning and fundraising has been completed for the replacement of lighting and windows at the MLK Center. The Rockville Centre Police Department and Rockville Centre School District continue to work together in practicing active drills to keep our students safe. Many successes, fun celebrations, and improvements were made throughout all of our departments over the past year.

In 2019, one of my goals as Deputy Mayor is to educate and encourage Rockville Centre residents to recycle throughout the year. The Village purchased and installed eight new recycling receptacles and 27 new trash receptacles. The recycling receptacles are bright blue and are located in the business section of our Village, and they are part of a pilot program. We are hopeful that residents and visitors will utilize the new recycling receptacles and if this pilot program is successful, the Village would like to purchase more such receptacles and expand the program. I hope you will help in this endeavor and encourage residents and visitors to recycle cans, bottles, and glass containers.

Our sanitation workforce continues to pick up recycling and trash throughout the week and, every Wednesday, paper and cardboard are picked up and recycled. I want to emphasize how important it is to hold on to your paper and cardboard and put them out for Wednesday morning pickups. The Village is charged \$69.00 per ton of trash, regardless of what the trash is compiled of, but only charged \$7.00 per ton for paper and cardboard. Therefore, when paper and cardboard are included with the regular trash, the village is charged much more. It is fiscally and environmentally beneficial to consolidate and put out our paper and cardboard on Wednesday mornings. The savings will be significant and every little bit helps! Members of the Board of Trustees plan to visit our elementary schools this spring to educate students on recycling in our Village. We are hopeful that, by educating our students, families as a whole will be encouraged to participate in our recycling programs.

Again, I wish all of our residents a happy and healthy 2019 which is shaping up to be an exciting year in Rockville Centre. I am honored to continue to work for you as your Deputy Mayor and the Board of Trustees, Mayor Murray, and I are excited for what 2019 will bring to the residents of Rockville Centre.
