Village Stays Under Tax Cap for Seventh Consecutive Year

For the seventh consecutive year, the Rockville Centre Board of Trustees adopted a budget for the next fiscal year that stays within the New York State Tax Cap program while maintaining all Village services at present levels. The budget of \$46,303,209 represents a new real estate tax rate of \$51.46 per \$100 of net assessed valuation, an increase of 2.8% above the 2019 Adopted Budget.

“Holding the line on taxes has been a priority of my administration,” said Mayor Francis X. Murray. “I believe this budget balances the need to hold down taxes and not impact the services that residents have come to expect and enjoy. The spending

plan we are putting forth is the product of a great deal of work by the Village, our Comptroller and our department heads to hold down costs wherever possible.”

The Village has long been recognized by the various rating agencies for their handling of fiscal matters. Most recently, the Village’s financial condition has recently been recognized by Standard & Poor’s rating of AAA, the highest possible rating. During the Mayor’s tenure, over \$32 million dollars in federal, state, local grants, and gifts have been secured to make improvements within the Village, saving tax payers additional costs. Much of the money has been used to improve

roadways, upgrade our water and electric infrastructure, parks and services for seniors. In addition, grants have been obtained to help our Police and Fire Departments utilize state-of-the-art equipment to keep residents safe.

“We will continue to look for ways to reduce costs and bring in additional revenue to the Village, including our aggressive pursuit of grant money, private/public partnerships, and gifts to make improvements at little expense to our residents,” continued Mayor Murray.

Real Estate Tax Due June 1, 2019

Village real estate tax bills due June 1st are scheduled to be mailed the week of May 20th. Taxes may be paid, without penalty, at the Cashier's Office in Village Hall, via U.S. mail or online at the Incorporated Village of Rockville Centre website www.rvcny.gov no later than July 1st.

Online payments may be issued via electronic check or credit card. There is no fee for paying by electronic check and a 2.75% convenience fee for paying by credit card. Credit card payments may only be made with either Mastercard or Visa.

New property owners and those who have satisfied, refinanced or sold their mortgage to another lending institution should contact the Tax Office as soon as possible either by telephone at (516) 678-9242, fax at (516) 678-9237 or email at taxoffice@rvcny.us in order to avoid billing errors that may lead to penalties for late real estate tax payments.

The Tax Office, located on the 1st floor of Village Hall at One College Place, is open weekdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.



Village Hall Comments by Mayor Francis X. Murray



When I first ran for Mayor in 2011, my goal was quite specific – make Rockville Centre a better place to live, raise a family, work, visit and retire. Since that time, Rockville Centre has been cited as one of the most desirable places in America to live, work, and play. We have been recognized for our smart growth by *Newsday*, *The New York Times*, *LI Press*, and the *LI Business News*. I am humbled and proud of this recognition and remain committed to serving each and every resident, as well as our merchants during my tenure as Mayor.

Rockville Centre is a highly desirable community in part because we are self-sustainable. Few communities in America enjoy their own Electric Department and low cost energy. We have our own highly

trained police force, dedicated Volunteer Fire Department and emergency personnel. Our Village employees are second to none, focusing their time on the needs and betterment of our community. Combine this with our excellent schools, beautiful updated parks and ball fields, our booming Recreation Center and Sandel Senior Center, our thriving downtown business district and you can easily see what makes our Village so special.

As part of our commitment to maintaining our infrastructure, the Village of Rockville Centre just completed its new Iron-Removal Treatment Plant located on Maple Avenue. The new plant provides up to 5.6 million gallons of iron free water daily to Village residents. Three of our four water towers have been refurbished, as well as our first Iron-Removal Treatment Plant. In addition to our water supply, the Village continues to improve our roadways. Throughout my tenure, we have renovated approximately 18 miles of roads, which is more than a quarter of our roadways. Most recently, our Department of Public Works is streetscaping on North Park Avenue, from Merrick Road to Sunrise Highway; North Village Avenue, from Sunrise Highway to the Long Island Rail Road station; and South Village Avenue, from Merrick Road to Lincoln Avenue. Streetscaping projects will include work on crosswalks, sidewalks, lighting and brick pavers. In addition, South Village Avenue, from Lincoln Avenue to Riverside Drive, and College Place, from North Park to Clinton avenues, are slated to be repaved. We are in the process of upgrading the Sewage Pump Station

located on Seaman Avenue at Knollwood Road to ensure that the plant continues to run safely and efficiently to remove sewage from Rockville Centre homes and transport it to the Bay Park treatment plant.

Our first responders play a critical role in our Village. We continue to look for ways to improve upon the equipment being used to ensure the safety of our emergency response workers, as well as our residents. To that end, during the last eight-years, five fire trucks were replaced, we increased our police force from 52 to 57 Police Officers, and we switched our police fleet from cars to trucks. Due to their commitment and training, the Village remains a very safe and sound community and one of the safest communities of its size in New York State.

Through play, children develop independence as well as social and problem solving skills. It is an excellent way of keeping children healthy and active in a safe environment. Throughout the past eight-years, we have refurbished all of our fields, added two new fields, and replaced the aging playground at the John A. Anderson Recreation Center. While we have worked hard to maintain Tighe Field, mud has been an issue for our players. Fortunately, with the help of our grant writer and the guidance of Senator Todd Kaminsky, the Village was recently notified that we are the recipient of a million dollar grant to turf Tighe Field.

I am proud to say that we have come a long way and even prouder to say that we have made

these great strides while holding the line on taxes. For the seventh consecutive year, the Rockville Centre Board of Trustees adopted a budget for the next fiscal year that stays within the New York State Tax Cap program while maintaining all Village services at present levels. This budget is the culmination of the keen dedication and hard work of each of our department heads to contain costs while providing the highest level of services to our residents. The Village has long been recognized by the various rating agencies for their handling of fiscal matters. Most recently, the Village's financial condition has recently been recognized by Standard & Poor's rating of AAA; the highest possible rating.

Throughout my tenure, over \$32 million dollars in federal, state, local grants, and gifts have been secured to make improvements within the Village, saving tax payers additional costs. Much of the money has been used to improve roadways, upgrade our water and electric infrastructure, parks and services for seniors, as well as help our Police and Fire Departments utilize state-of-the-art equipment to keep residents safe. Rockville Centre Loses Longest Serving Mayor

The Village of Rockville Centre is mourning the loss of its longest-serving Mayor, Eugene J. Murray, who passed away on April 2, 2019 at the age of 93. Murray served three years on the Village's Board of Trustees before he was elected as Mayor in 1987, 1991, 1999, and 2003.

The lifelong Rockville Centre resident, Murray was one of 13 children born to William Murray, who served as the Village's postmaster, and his wife, Josephine. He served in the Army in 1944 during World War II and returned home to start his own business, Murray Floor Waxing Service, which he operated for four decades. Murray was named the recipient of the Rockville Centre Chamber of Commerce's first "Businessman of the Year" award.

During his twenty years as Mayor, Murray established the RVC Community Fund that has supported numerous residents and charities in need during and after his tenure. Over the past three decades, the fund has raised more than \$1.6 million. He was an active member of

the Rockville Centre Fire Department for 72 years, serving as a chief from 1977 to 1983. Murray also served as President of the New York Conference of Mayors (NYCOM), as well as President of the Nassau County Village Officials Association (NCVOA).

Murray received numerous accolades for his public service including "Man of the Year" in 1993 by Molloy College, which also awarded him an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree in 1994, and "Citizen of the Year" in 1997 by the RVC Kiwanis Club. Murray was also recognized for his community service by numerous organizations including the Nassau County Boy Scouts Council, the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, Guiding Light Lodge of the Masonic Order, the Martin Luther King Scholarship Fund Award, the Hispanic Brotherhood, and the RVC Guild for the Arts.

Mayor Eugene Murray set the standard as the longest sitting Mayor in Rockville Centre history. In appreciation of his service to the community as Mayor, Village Hall was named in his honor when he retired in 2007.
