

2025 Spring Hydrant Flushing

The Water Department will be flushing hydrants starting Wednesday, April 23rd and ending on Tuesday, April 29th. The flushing of the hydrants may cause some fluctuation of water pressure and/or discolored water to flow into homes and businesses. The water is perfectly safe to drink though it may stain laundry. Consumers are advised not to schedule projects which require clear water before or after the date assigned to your area. The water will be both chemically and bacteriologically safe to drink



Viewpoint: Comments by Trustee Katie Conlon

The Rockville Centre Department of Public Works (DPW) encompasses several different departments that are vital to our Village running smoothly. Included within the Department of Public Works is our Sanitation and Recycling Department, our Sewer Department, our Parks Department and our Highway and Road Department. Also housed within our DPW is our own garage and mechanics who work to keep our fleet of trucks and vehicles on the road and running, whenever possible doing maintenance and repairs in-house, saving the Village and taxpayers money.

As liaison to DPW, I know firsthand how vital this Department is to our quality of life. Our highly skilled and dedicated employees plan, build, operate, manage and maintain the vital services and infrastructure we often take for granted. As an Incorporated Village with our own DPW, we are able to tailor services that fit the specific needs of our community, as Curran to go towards repaving the entrance and for our residents, which in turn results in secured a \$500,000 grant from former NYS timely assistance.

Our Parks Department staff works hard to prepare and maintain all of our 15 athletic fields throughout the Village. These fields are in constant use by numerous teams and athletic organizations of all ages. Thanks to the hard work of our grant writer, Suzanne Sullivan, over \$6,000,000 in grants and gifts has funded many

improvements and upgrades to our athletic facilities, such as refurbishing many of our fields with turf, lighting, drainage, and state-ofthe-art technology. I am pleased to announce that a \$50,000 grant was secured by RVC Little League from former NYS Assemblyman Brian

well as provide a direct line of communication turfing both Hickey and Joyce Fields. We also

Senator Kevin Thomas for Hickey Field improvements.

Having our own DPW allows us to react more quickly to the needs of our Village, such as road and pothole repairs and snow removal. Over the past fifteen years over 22 miles of roadway have been repaved while addressing necessary infrastructure upgrades, such as water mains and storm

drains. When snow and ice is forecasted, our DPW staff is responsible for salting and clearing 53 miles of Village roads, 30 parking fields and all Village owned sidewalks. They work at all hours of the day and night to keep us safe. To aid in this endeavor, this past year the Village invested in a salt storage facility that can hold approximately 1600 tons of rock salt. This salt storage facility was partially funded by money from the American Rescue Plan Act and has allowed our DPW staff to work more effectively and efficiently.

Being an Incorporated Village comes with many benefits, specifically having a greater ability to shape our local environment and provide services that are specifically geared towards the needs of our Village and community. I want to take this opportunity to thank all of our DPW staff, including Co-Directors Gwynne Feiner and John Thorpe, for their constant and tireless work to keep our Village running smoothly, efficiently and safely. We are very fortunate to have such a dedicated team at the ready, constantly assessing and anticipating needs and issues throughout our Village.



Garbage should be placed in standard garbage containers with $\underline{\text{detachable}}$ lids. **NO LARGER THAN 32 GALLONS**

Garbage should not exceed 50 pounds

Please do not over fill plastic garbage bags as they can easily tear.

To prevent injury to our village employees, please use caution when disposing of any broken glass or sharp objects. Please securely wrap broken glass in newspaper or brown paper or place inside cardboard box, tape shut and label broken glass. Do not place broken glass in plastic bags

E-Cycling:

Drop off your e-cycling items on the first Saturday of every month between 10am and 2pm at 10 Sunrise Hwy including: Televisions, Computers, Monitors, VCRs, DVDs, iPads, Cable boxes, Cameras or Video Cameras, Telephones (any type), GPS, Calculators
