Village Bids Farewell to Dedicated Public Servants

The Village bid farewell to three longtime dedicated team members this June. Trustee Michael Sepe, Rockville Centre Police Department Commissioner James Vafeades, and Director of Senior Services Chris O'Leary have retired after 70 years of combined service.

A fierce advocate for the Village of Rockville Centre, Trustee Sepe was elected to the Village of Rockville Centre Board of Trustees in 2011 and re-elected in 2015 and 2019. Trustee Sepe served as a Nassau County Assistant District Attorney before founding his law practice, Michael Sepe, LLC, in Rockville Centre. Throughout the years, he has utilized his legal expertise to the benefit of the Rockville Centre community.



During his tenure as Village Trustee, he served as liaison to the Rockville Centre Police Department, Building Department, the Nassau County Legislature, and as a member of the Rockville Centre Board of Ethics. Trustee Sepe did not seek re-election in the June election. Trustee Sepe was honored for serving the community with dedication and commitment for the last 12 years at the June Board of Trustees meeting.

After 33 years of devoted service to the Rockville Centre Police Department, Commissioner James Vafeades has retired. A graduate of St. John's University with a bachelor's degree in accounting, Vafeades joined the Rockville Centre Police Department in 1990. He went on to graduate the FBI's National Academy in 2011 and attained a master's degree in criminal justice from Molloy University. His dedication and hard work earned him a promotion to Police Sergeant in 2002 and Police Lieutenant in 2010, before his appointment to Police Commissioner in 2018. As Commissioner, Vafeades was responsible for planning,



organizing, supervising and directing the activities of all 58 officers and 36 civilian employees in the department. He served throughout the coronavirus pandemic and played a pivotal role in the construction of the new state-of-the-art police headquarters on Maple Avenue. Commissioner Vafeades was honored for his service at the June Board of Trustees meeting and had his final walkout of police headquarters on June 29th.

"Commissioner James Vafeades devoted more than three decades of his life to serving and protecting our residents and visitors," commented Mayor Francis X. Murray. "Because of his diligent service and leadership, Rockville Centre is one of the safest cities in the United States. Throughout his tenure, he has demonstrated dedication. commitment, and professionalism. He will truly be missed."

Director O'Leary began her career with the Sandel Senior Center in 1998 coordinating events and classes part time. In 2001, she began as a full time Program Coordinator before becoming the Deputy Director in 2002, and Director in 2013. Over her tenure, Director O'Leary has faithfully and thoroughly fulfilled her roles and responsibilities, frequently going above and beyond. Director O'Leary was honored for her invaluable contributions that positively impacted the lives of countless members



of the Sandel Center at the June Board of Trustees meeting, as well as a retirement party given by the Sandel Center on June 9th.

The S&P report went on to say that the rating reflects its assessment on multiple factors for the Village including good financial management policies and practices, conservative budgeting, and recurring surpluses and very strong reserves.

any dead or weak trees and limbs removed.





Unlike waste water that goes into our sanitary sewers, storm water, and all that it is carrying, is not treated before being discharged to our surrounding water bodies. Storm Water comes from precipitation that flows across

the ground or pavement when it rains or when snow and ice melt.

Storm water pollution can harm fish & other aquatic wildlife, native vegetation. destroy and make recreational areas unsafe and unpleasant. Nutrients carried by storm water may also cause undesirable algae and vegetative

Substances carried by storm water that are considered to be pollutants are: sediment, trash, and debris, oil grease, and toxic chemicals, soap and paint products from outdoor maintenance activities. Please help protect our storm water by:

- Do not over-water. If water flows off your yard onto your driveway or sidewalk, your system is over watering.
- Do not rake or blow leaves or clippings into the street, gutter or storm drain.

Instead, dispose of waste by composting or bagging it and placing it with your household waste for pickup

• Follow directions on pesticides and fertilizers, (measure, do not estimate amounts). Do not use if rain is

predicted within 48 hours

- Always pick up after your pet. Flush waste down the toilet or dispose of it in the trash.
- **NEVER** DEPOSIT PET WASTE DIRECTLY IN STORM DRAIN!

• Pool and spa water must be de-chlorinated and be free of excess acid, alkali or

- When draining your pool all water should be directed to a drywell on your
- Take your vehicle to a commercial car wash whenever possible. If you wash your vehicle at home, choose soaps or detergents labeled non-toxic, phosphate free or biodegradable
- Take items such as used batteries, oven cleaners, automotive fluids, painting products, TVs and computer monitors to a household Hazardous Waste Collection Center.
